Itaru Mishiku is a Japanese contemporary sculptor born in Shizuoka. He moved to Italy in 1974 and studied sculpture under the internationally acclaimed Italian sculptor Emilio Greco (1913-1995) at the Accademia di Belle Arti di Roma until 1977. At first his work was figurative and realistic before moving on to abstract as he pursued the concept of capturing space within his pieces. He was based in Rome until 1994 and is currently active both in Italy and Japan. His work has been exhibited internationally and Mishiku has received numerous commissions for large works in public spaces, mainly in Italy and Japan.
